DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What is the best thing someone has ever done for you that required at least a considerable investment of time on their part?
- 2. Read Mark 10:35-45. How did Jesus respond to the conflict between James, John, and the other disciples in verse 41?
- 3. Jesus said that whoever wants to be a *leader* must be a servant, and whoever wants to be *first* (or most significant) should be a slave. How does that mindset compare to how our world usually works?
- 4. As a group, watch the story of the Dennehy family online at vimeo.com/60221183. People told the parents that serving and adopting kids with special needs would "ruin" their family. What do you think choosing the path they did cost the Dennehy family? What do you think they gained?
- 5. How might God be leading you to "ruin" your normal way of doing life so that you can serve others in a significant way?
